
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Appearance to the Apostles by the Sea

(Miraculous Catch of Fish)

April 17, 2016



إنجيل القديس يوحنا 21

ولَمَّا طَلَعَ الفَجْر، وَقَفَ يَسُوعُ عَلَى الشَّاطِئ، ولكِنَّ التَّلامِيذَ لَمْ يَعْلَمُوا أَنَّهُ يَسُوع. فَقَالَ لَهُم يَسُوع: «يَا فِتْيَان، أَمَا عِنْدَكُم قَلِيلٌ مِنَ السَّمَك؟». أَجَابُوه: «لا!». فَقَالَ لَهُم: «أَلْقُوا الشَّبَكةَ إلى يَمِينِالسَّفِينَةِ تَجِدُوا». وأَلقَوْ هَا، فَمَا قَدِرُوا عَلَى ٱجْتِذَابِهَا مِنْ كَثْرَةِ السَّمَك. فَقَالَ ذلِكَ التِّلْمِيذُ الَّذي كَانَ يَسُوعُ يُحِبُّهُ لِبُطْرُس: «إِنَّهُ الرَّبّ». فَلَمَّا سَمِعَ سِمْعَانُ بُطْرُسُ أَنَّهُ الرَّبّ، إِتَّزَرَ بِثَوْبِهِ، لأَنَّهُ كَانَ عُرْيَانًا، وأَلْقَى بِنَفْسِهِ في البُحَيْرَة. أَمَّا التَّلامِيذُ الأَخَرُونَ فَجَاؤُوا بِٱلسَّفِينَة، وهُمْ يَسْحَبُونَ الشَّبَكَةَ المَمْلُوءَة سَمَكًا، ومَا كَانُوا بَعِيدِينَ عَنِ البَرِّ إِلاَّ نَحْوَ مِئَتَى ذِرَاع.

Gospel of John 21:1-14

When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish.

Fishing and Eating with the Risen Lord

Today we have a resurrection story which is very unique. It is a story full of symbolism. We see seven disciples, seemingly at a loose end with nothing to do. Peter, the leader, decides to make a move. "I'm going fishing." It is what he knows best. The others go along with him. Is there an implication that they return to their old way of living? After a whole night on the lake they get nothing. Is there also an echo of Jesus words, "without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5)?

As the light of dawn breaks Jesus is standing on the shore but, they do not recognize him. He asks the question fishermen do not like to be asked, "Have you caught anything?" Reluctantly they have to admit: No. He then gives them some suggestions. And he leads the fish to them as he will lead people to them later on.

Fishers of people is a work whose success will originate in the power of Jesus behind them and in their following what he tells them to do. The "disciple Jesus loved" immediately saw the connection: "It is the Lord!" he exclaims.

Peter, the leader, brings in the huge catch from the boat by the water's edge. Peter alone dragging the net in is an image of the Kingdom coming. It also signifies the special position of Peter in the mission of the Apostles.

This friendly stranger invites them to come and eat with him the meal he has prepared for them. Again we are being taught to find the presence of the Lord in all those who are kind to us, who do good to us in any way and especially in those who share the Eucharistic meal with us.

His identity in a way is now confirmed by his taking the bread and the fish and giving it to them to eat. He broke bread, he celebrated a Eucharist with them.

So how we should best "manage our time": It is by keeping Christ at the forefront of our thoughts and actions.
