Season of Glorious Birth Birth of John the Baptist December 09, 2018



The day on which a saint is usually honored is the day on which he departed the earthly life for the spiritual kingdom of heaven. But exceptions are made for three persons. First and foremost is the celebration of the birth of Christ on December 25. The second birthday observance is that of the Virgin Mary, the Mother of the Savior, and the third is reserved for St. John the Baptist.

To the West a person's birthday takes precedence over the so-called name day in which a person is given his name. The Eastern tradition calls for a celebration, both joyous and solemn, on the day when a person receive his name. So important is this day because when a person is given a name he receives, as well, his mission in God's plan.

The name John means graced by Yahweh or God is gracious. His mission was to pave the way for Christ, by calling people to repentance, and by baptizing Jesus in the Jordan.

From the Letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians 4:21-5:1

Tell me, you who desire to be subject to the law, will you not listen to the law? For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by a slave woman and the other by a free woman. One, the child of the slave, was born according to the flesh; the other, the child of the free woman, was born through the promise. Now this is an allegory: these women are two covenants. One woman, in fact, is Hagar, from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery. Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia and corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children. But the other woman corresponds to the Jerusalem above; she is free, and she is our mother. For it is written, "Rejoice, you childless one, you who bear no children, burst into song and shout, you who endure no birth pangs; for the children of the desolate woman are more numerous than the children of the one who is married." Now you, my friends, are children of the promise, like Isaac. But just as at that time the child who was born according to the flesh persecuted the child who was born according to the Spirit, so it is now also. But what does the scripture say? "Drive out the slave and her child; for the child of the slave will not share the inheritance with the child of the free woman." So then, friends, we are children, not of the slave but of the free woman. For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

From the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke 1:57-66

Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father. But his mother said, "No; he is to be called John." They said to her, "None of your relatives has this name." Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. He asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And all of them were amazed. Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. Fear came over all their neighbors, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. All who heard them pondered them and said, "What then will this child become?" For, indeed, the hand of the Lord was with him.
