



Third Sunday of Pentecost Season The Spirit Teaches May 29, 2016



From the first Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians 2:1-10

Brothers and Sisters,

When I came to you, brothers, proclaiming the mystery of God, I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling, and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of spirit and power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet we do speak a wisdom to those who are mature, but not a wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age who are passing away. Rather, we speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory, and which none of the rulers of this age knew; for if they had known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But as it is written: "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him," this God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit scrutinizes everything, even the depths of God.

Praise be to God always!

From the Holy Gospel according to Saint John 14:21-27

Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me.

And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father,

And I will love him and reveal myself to him."

Judas, not the Iscariot, said to him,

"Master, what happened that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world?"

Jesus answered and said to him,

"Whoever loves me will keep my word,

And my Father will love him,

And we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Whoever does not love me does not keep my words;

Yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me."

I have told you this while I am with you.

The Advocate, the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—

He will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.

Not as the world gives do I give it to you.

Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.

This is The Truth, Peace be with you.

The Spirit Teaches

In this brief but powerful passage from the Gospel of John, Jesus repeats his favorite theme: love. Jesus emphasizes the intimate unity of God, Jesus, the Spirit, and the believer. Finally, He promises the Holy Spirit, the Divine Gift that comes from the Father in the name of Jesus.

Love

Fifty-seven times Jesus uses love verbs (agape). Jesus declares that if his disciples love him, they will observe his commandments. The reader may ask, "What commandments?" Saint John speaks of one Commandment: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another, Just as I have loved you ..." (John 13:34). Because if we fail in love, we fail in all things else.

Judgment and eternal life begin now. At the end of each day, and during each moment of each day there's only one question to ask yourself: "In what ways did I or did I not love today?"

The Quattrinity

Christians are familiar with the Trinity, but perhaps the most stunning feature of the Fourth Gospel is the Quattrinity. In John, Jesus insists that the intimate relationship that exists between him, God, and the Spirit also includes believers. The believer does not stand close by admiring the majesty of the Trinity; rather, we are called to be a part of it (abide, love, being "in").

If God and Christ have made their home with us, how can we imagine there to be any distance between us and God? The life of God is available for us from this moment into eternity.

The Holy Spirit

What appeared to be bad news to the disciples, namely Jesus' departure from them, turned out to be the best of news for both them and us. While Jesus walked the earth, his ministry was limited to one area and one person, himself. Upon his departure, his disciples are given the Spirit and moved from learners to full mature revealers of God's love. And this happens not just to the first disciples, but all those who would come later, those who never saw the historical Jesus. Everything they were taught and experienced is available in the same degree and quality to us.

The word Paraclete (parakletos) has a range of meanings in the Greek: Comforter, Advocate, Counselor, and Helper. The Holy Spirit do the following: teach, remind (John14:26), abide (John 14:16), and testify about Jesus (John 15:26). Like Jesus, the Holy Spirit deals in truth.

REMEMBER IT

The Paraclete, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name — he will teach you everything And remind you of all that I told you.

I was and am grateful that Our Lord has given me some extra time in my journey to spend with my children and especially my grandchildren.

The most difficult thing to accept, no matter how much time God has chosen to give each of us is that "we are not in charge". Everything that goes on in our lives is in God's hands. "Thy Will be done" is something that we all must accept and, therefore, be prepared at all times to be called to complete our journey. "When God goes to His rolodex on any given day and pulls up any name, there is nothing we can do but accept His Will".
