## **From the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians 2:11-16**

For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God.

This is what we speak, not in words taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, explaining spiritual truth to those who are Spiritual. The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit. The person with the Spirit makes discernments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments, for "Who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?"

But we have the mind of Christ.

## **From the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke 10:21-24**

At that very moment, Jesus rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said, "I give you praise, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the childlike.

Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows who the Son is except the Father, and who the Father is except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him."

Turning to the disciples in private he said, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see. For I say to you, many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it."
